Our guest speaker will be Marjorie Sullivan who is the Salvage Archaeologist with the National Parks and Wildlife Service.

Marjorie will talk on aboriginal relics in Ku-ring-gai as they relate to the pre-history of N.S.W. These relics include rock engravings, occupation sites, burial sites and stone arrangements.

Ku-ring-gai is fortunate to have many of these relics to remind us of the days when the Ku-ring-gai tribe lived in the area.

Cur guest speaker will explain how these relics have enlightened us about aspects of aboriginal life, and what measures are being taken to preserve this important part of our heritage.

Slides will be shown and question time will follow the talk.

KU-RING-GAI CCUNCIL'S BUSHLAND MANAGEMENT WORKING PARTY.

CONGRATULATIONS TO COUNCIL:

S.T.E.P. is delighted to report that Council has accepted the recommendations of this Committee and allocated \$35,000 for a survey of all Ku-ring-gai's bushland and the publication of a pamphlet on urban bushland. An additional sum of \$25,000 has been reserved for the production of an educational film on Ku-ring-gai's bushland.

SURVEY. The survey is long overdue. It is essential that the Committee has detailed information on the components of bushland in each locality before a management policy is formulated.

S.T.E.P. led the way with its Plan of Management for the Upper Lane Cove Valley, and is hopeful that the end result of Council's funding of the bushland survey will be enlightened management policies for all bushland areas of the municipality.

EDUCATION--FILM AND PAMPHLET. The funding for the film and the pamphlet on urban bushland is also most welcome. The Committee is very conscious of the fact that some people have the mistaken idea that bushland is indestructible.

Urban bushland varies greatly from other bushland in that we who

live nearby place tremendous additional pressures on it. Some of these pressures include the dumping of lawn clippings and garden rubbish; the dispersal of seed into the bush from non-indigenous plants in our gardens; the increased run-off of water carrying fertilizers from our lawns and gardens into the bush; the removal of plants, rocks, leaf mulch and soil; the damage, noise and pollution from trail bikes and the recent pressures from BMX bikes riding through vegetation.

The aims of the film and the pamphlet will be to promote an increased awareness in the general public of these pressures placed on urban bushland, and to enlist their support in conserving this valuable resource.
